Things To Know for 1st Grade

Your child should be able to:

recite, not sing, the alphabet.

count to 100.

count by 10s

identify simple shapes

read at least 50 BASIC sight words

tell a story

read “Kindergarten” level books

write a simple sentence

write their first and last name, spelled correctly.

dress themselves, including tucking in blouses or shirts.

sit in a chair without falling for 20 consecutive minutes.

identify simple sounds.

identify household objects.

pack their backpack.

blow and wipe their noses and dispose of tissue.

eat at a table using the proper utensils.

Your child should know the name of your street.

Your child should know their birthday.
